




The R Rules has been used in schools as a curriculum for advisory, a one-semester or a full-year course, a series of courses over multiple years, and dual credit courses delivered on campus or online.



Exceeded Expectations

Scores of students participating in the GEAR UP program at ALL participating schools exceeded expectations as measured by NWEA, the school district's standardized assessment.





In New Mexico and Louisiana, youth in the judicial system have used The R Rules to earn credit toward high school graduation, to prepare for reentry, and to meet grade court program requirements.

Recognition from the White House

A Wisconsin school district received recognition from the White House for their efforts, which include an increased graduation rate (from 50% to 94% in 2012), increased college enrollment and completion, and in 2014, 93% of the district's high school seniors graduated with college credits.
