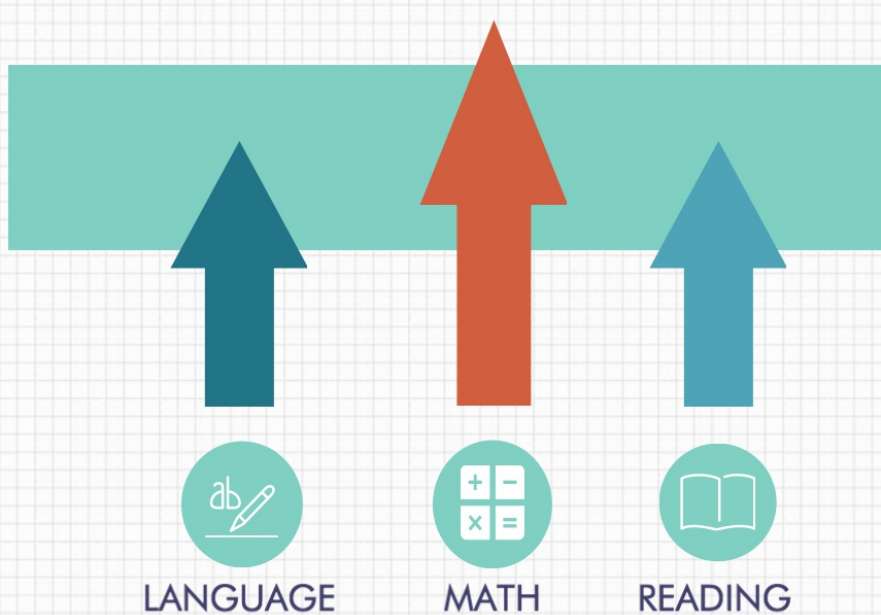
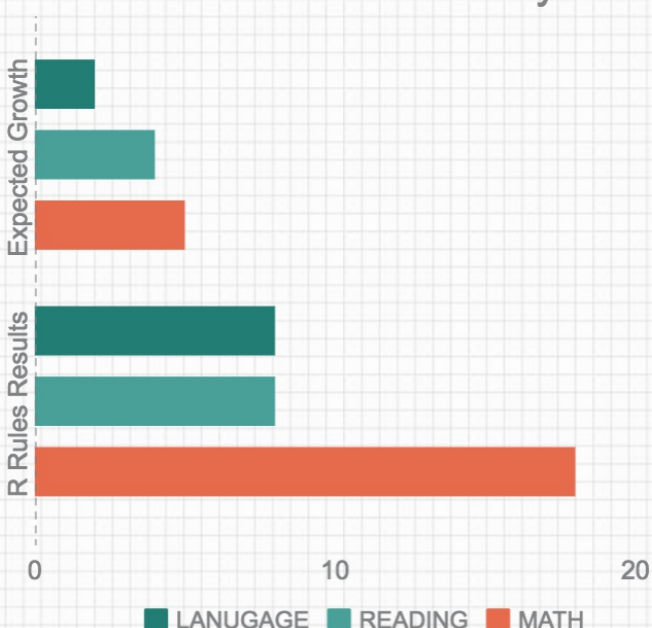

## Recognition from the White House

A Wisconsin school district received recognition from the White House for their efforts, which include an increased graduation rate (from 50% to 94% in 2012), increased college enrollment and completion, and in 2014, 93% of the district's high school seniors graduated with college credits.

## Gets Results

- 804 one-semester credits recovered
- 528 Advanced Placement exams passed
- 307 dual credits earned = 921 New Mexico college credits
- 80 early graduates
- 4,245 student hours of community leadership
- GEAR UP students developed and managed a speakers bureau for their school
- 2012 enrollment at the local community college increased by 200%
- Increase in scholarships awarded
- District had the highest completion rate of FAFSA in the state
