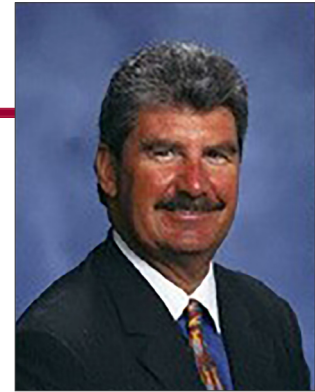


Jim Littlejohn
